

IDAHO'S TOTAL **SOLAR ECLIPSE** 2017



TIPS FOR IDAHO BUSINESSES

On August 21, 2017 Idaho will experience its first total solar eclipse in 38 years. The "path of totality," where the eclipse will occur, passes right through the heart of our state. Hotels are already selling out and communities in the path are expecting a huge influx of travelers -- anywhere from 100,000 to 1 million or more across the state.

These visitors present a huge economic opportunity to Idaho businesses and communities, and our goal is for everyone to be ready to ensure a smooth week (or longer) of visitors. You can expect visitors to start arriving in your area as early as August 17, so we recommend starting preparations early.

EXPECT MORE CUSTOMERS

Grocery stores, gas stations, hotels, restaurants, transportation services, coffee shops, retail stores, urgent care clinics, and other business establishments will experience an increase in business. Ensure you have adequate staff, factoring in possible overtime; stock up on water, sanitary items for public restrooms, and sufficient products and supplies to ensure business traffic flows smoothly.

BE READY FOR MORE CASH TRANSACTIONS

With increased credit card transactions, processing times may increase. Consider backup tills to accommodate more cash transactions. If you have an on-site ATM, consider increasing the on-hand cash amount in advance.

FUEL UP

Encourage employees to fill their gas tanks prior to visitors arriving in the area to ensure their ability to get to work. Fuel stocks could become overtaxed, so gas stations should also plan accordingly for more customers and the possibility of running out of gas.

TALK TO SUPPLIERS

Plan ahead with your supplies to ensure delivery schedules during the weeks leading up to, and during the eclipse. Suppliers may need to consider the impact of increased traffic on rural roads.

DISPLAY SAFETY INFORMATION

Be aware of current camp fire restrictions and road conditions in your area, and consider sharing and posting fire prevention tips and materials in your business. Out-of-town visitors may be camping and not aware of restrictions, so any additional education materials could have a profound impact on Idaho lands.

We also recommend being aware of, and posting, local emergency contact information in addition to 9-1-1.
