

WHAT DOES YOUR NEXT ADVENTURE LOOK LIKE?

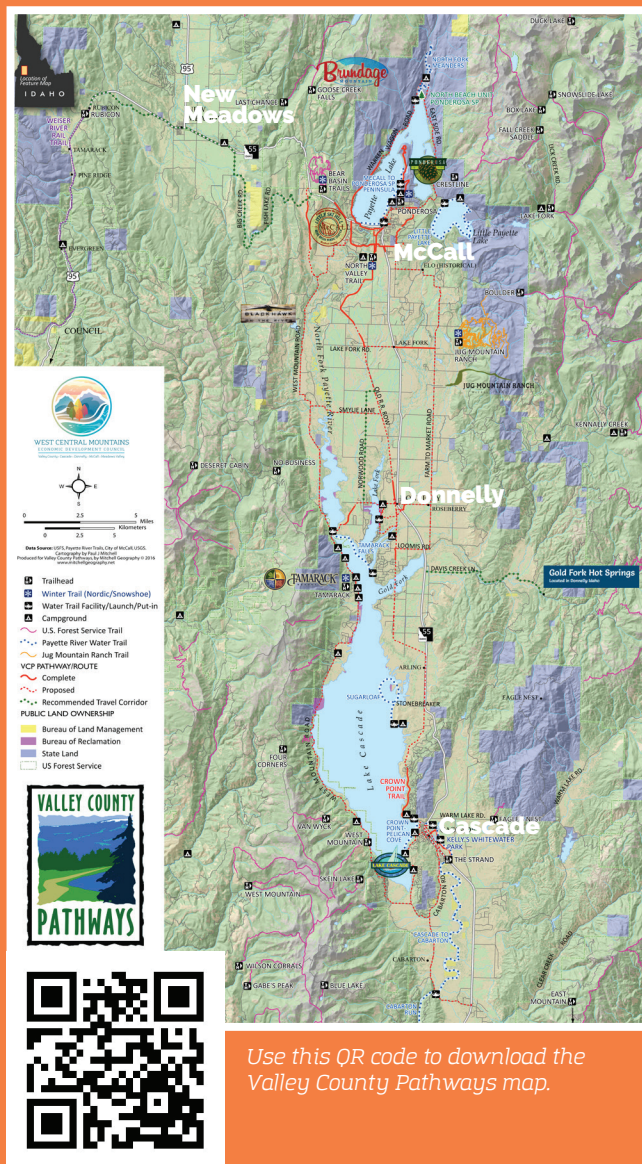

Summer highlights include regional 4th of July celebrations, Thunder Mountain Days in Cascade, and Yellow Pine's Annual Golf Tournament. Later in July, bicyclists gear up for the 90 mile, 4 Summit Challenge, and August brings Donnelly's popular Huckleberry Festival.

Every winter, crowds arrive from across the U.S. to celebrate McCall's Winter Carnival. Beyond the festivities are three ski resorts and endless miles of trails for XC skiers and snowmobilers.

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FOUR SEASONS, HUNDREDS OF OPTIONS.

Mountain biking, hiking, trail running, and backpacking: Hundreds of miles of single track and remote mountain roads. For more info and maps: www.valleycountypathways.org.

Fly fishing: Salmon River, Payette River, Payette Lake, Cascade Lake, and hundreds of remote mountain lakes.

Stand-up paddle boarding and canoeing: Nearly 100 miles of water trails. *Use this QR code to access the Payette River Basin Water Trails storymap.*



Rafting and kayaking: From casual family day trips to Class V whitewater kayaking.

Boating, swimming, wakeboarding, water skiing, and jet skiing: 35,413 acres of accessible water on Lake Cascade and Payette Lake.

Alpine skiing and snowboarding: Brundage Mountain, Tamarack Resort, and Little Ski Hill.

Snow biking and XC skiing: Jug Mountain, Bear Basin and area trail heads.

Snowmobiling: Endless opportunities from every town in the region.

Ice fishing: Some of the best ice fishing on earth on Lake Cascade.

Hot springing: Gold Fork, Burgdorf, Zims, or ask a local about their favorite secret spot.

Over 88% of the land is National Forest and the region's rugged terrain makes it perfect for nearly every outdoor activity.

Golfing: McCall Golf Club, Jug Mountain Ranch, Golf Cascade, Meadow Creek, Tamarack, White Tail.

Bird watching: See Bald Eagles, birds of prey and lots of beautiful non-predatory species.

Shopping and local artisans: Dozens of locally owned boutiques and galleries between Cascade, McCall, New Meadows, and Donnelly.

Wining and dining: Some of the best local eateries in the Northwest.

Local craft beer tastings: Salmon River Brewery, McCall Brewing Company, and Broken Horn Brewing Company.

AREA HIGHLIGHTS.

The Annual 4th of July celebrations in the West Central Mountains are not to be missed. Thousands of patrons converge on McCall and the surrounding towns for a party of epic proportions. Massive fireworks shows bring spectators from all over the country. Restaurants and pubs are filled with live music and great food. For quieter surroundings, there are family-friendly campgrounds nearby, where you can disconnect from the Internet and reconnect with each other.

Also in July, the mountains are filled with the sound of music. Performers from across the U.S. come to play at the Summer Music Festival in Roseberry, and the Huckleberry Jam at Tamarack Resort.

Every February, roughly 70,000 people converge on the West Central Mountains to take part in the McCall Winter Carnival—a showcase of sport, art, food, and good times. Dozens of elaborate snow sculptures are erected throughout the region. Snowmobiling and ice fishing competitions assemble, and people gather to enjoy all the region has to offer. Events are everywhere, with an endless supply of delicious food, fun and entertainment for all ages.
